Like many charter schools, ACE Leadership often has to get creative in providing career advisement to students at its trades-forward high school in Albuquerque.

At ACE, a school for students interested in designing and building trades, career counseling is delivered by a combination of teachers, administrators, and, most importantly, members of the business and industry community who hope to someday employee these students, according to Executive Director Justin Trager.

"One of the most important objectives of our strategic plan is to enhance the connection between ACE's curriculum and career readiness in construction and related industries," he said. "What better way to do that than have our business partners come in, add to the lessons by embedding the skills our students are going to need to succeed in these careers."



At ACE, Career Technical Education (CTE) is embedded in the school day, every day. Trager said the plan's core is to:

- Build on existing relationships with employers to establish deep and ongoing partnerships.
- Expand community engagement to help broker jobs for students.
- framework and vertically align course offerings to the framework in a way that scaffolds student learning from enrollment through capstone and graduation, including the growth of their internal micro-credential initiative.

To ensure these goals are accomplished, Trager created an industry liaison position at the school. Their Community Engagement Coordinator is Matt Salas, who goes into the community to build relationships, spread the school's mission and get industry to buy into the promise that the school can train students in skills needed to pursue a career or further education in postsecondary institutions.

"Once they hear our message, business owners want to help us," Salas said. "They see the benefit in having students who are interested in trades jobs AND come out of our school with measurable skills to build on."

Employability skills such as showing up on time, being ready to work, engaged in learning, and developing good social behaviors in the workplace are sometimes the most important messages that businesspeople deliver to the students.

Trager, in his second year as ACE Director, said that he knew getting the industry framework part of the strategic plan correct was essential to the school's success.

"I knew if we were going to fulfill the promise, we shouldn't rely on old standards of teaching," he said. "It was going to take the community coming into the school to help teachers grow a curriculum that is real-world."

Industry and community partners are involved in classrooms in many ways, including giving input on equipment and supplies needed to make the spaces more like industry shops. Employees from the businesses come in for demonstrations or to guide student projects. For example, if the lesson is in prosthetics, Salas enlists the help of an orthopedic doctor or surgeon. The school has hosted carpenters, sheet metal workers, welders, plumbers, electricians, and experts in almost every skilled trade.

One of the newest programs of study ACE is building is set design and construction for the film industry and various live theater venues, including the Santa Fe Opera. Experts in both film and the opera have participated in building the program, said Trager.

"It's high-level engagement," said Salas. "People come in and the students rise to the occasion, welcoming these professionals into our classes."

Every Thursday is "Trade Thursday" at ACE, where

businesses and industry bring their expertise to the school and talk to students about next steps, what skills they will need to get a job in their fields, and how to keep their personal lives on a straight path.

Trager knows how important counselors are to the school structure, and he praises all the work being asked of them in recent years. Three social workers are available at the school to help students with any social, emotional issues they may be experiencing.

ACE Leadership's students walk away with at least two industry recognized credentials before they graduate. They develop skills and confidence in a trade they are interested in pursuing, said Trager.

"Most importantly, our students are getting career advice from someone who was once in their shoes, and who now is working in the trade, earning a paycheck, and giving back to students," he said. "This framework has become a highly satisfying reciprocal relationship."











#### THIS MONTH'S TECHNOLOGY TIP

#### Don't know what to do with your old cell phone?

Don't throw it away! Instead, place it in your glove box or give it to your parents or children as an emergency phone.

All wireless phones, even those that are not subscribed to, or supported by, a specific carrier, can call 911. However, calls to 911 on phones without active service do not deliver the caller's location to the 911 call center, and the call center cannot call these phones back to find out the caller's location or the nature of the emergency. If disconnected, the 911 center has no way to locate or call back.

So, always start with "This is an emergency, I'm at....." if using an old cell phone for emergencies!

## ASCA SEEKING BOARD OF DIRECTORS APPLICANTS

The American School Counselor Association (ASCA) is seeking board members for 2022. To be eligible for nomination to the ASCA Board of Directors, candidates must:

- Be employed full-time in school counseling in a school, school district, or state department of education or as a full-time faculty member in a school counselor education program on Jan. 31 of the year applying.
- Have served as a practicing school counselor for at least five years as of Jan. 31 of the year applying.
- Hold a valid school counselor license or certificate issued by a state department of education or equivalent state or federal agency on Jan. 31 of the year applying.
- Be a current professional member of ASCA, including holding membership for a minimum of five continuous years immediately preceding Jan. 31 of the year applying.

- Have completed the ASCA U School Counseling Leadership Specialist or the School Counseling Association Leadership Specialist no more than five years prior to Jan. 31 of the year applying. (Either Specialist training will be accepted through Jan. 31, 2024. Beginning with the Jan. 31, 2025, deadline, only the School Counseling Association Leadership Specialist will be accepted.)
- Demonstrate commitment to school counseling and ASCA.
- In addition to knowledge about, and experience in, the school counseling field, leadership candidates should be able to demonstrate commitment and service to ASCA, a working knowledge of the Policy Governance© Model, and a temperament that contributes to, and generates, group consensus, wisdom, and vision.

## ASCA SEEKING BOARD OF DIRECTORS APPLICANTS (CONT.)

#### Responsibilities:

Board service requires the following travel:

- Typically, two-three in-person board meetings, usually over weekends
- ASCA Annual Conference (typically in mid-July)
- Leadership Development Institute (immediately preceding the ASCA Annual Conference)
- Delegate Assembly (immediately preceding the ASCA Annual Conference)
- Representation at other state school counselor association annual conferences (number of conferences, dates and locations are determined annually)
- Midyear Leadership Development Institute
- Recommended attendance at home state school counselor association annual conference
- Additional face-to-face or virtual meetings that may be called throughout the year.
- Additional travel, such as representation at other conferences or meetings, that may also be required throughout the year.

#### **Campaign Process:**

- Candidates shall not enlist current or past state or national ASCA leaders to solicit votes on their behalf.
- Candidates shall refrain from using ASCA resources to solicit votes, including ASCA-sponsored speaking opportunities and posting messages of any kind on ASCA social media, including the website, social network, listservs, and other media, from the time the slate is

- announced until the end of the balloting period.
- Candidates who are found to be in violation of these campaign policies may be disqualified from the election.
- Current and past ASCA board members are not permitted to endorse or to solicit votes for individual candidates.
- State school counselor associations may promote the elections as a whole, but may not use association resources to endorse, promote, or solicit votes for individual candidates. No appearance shall be given that ASCA or a state school counselor association is endorsing a candidate.
- ASCA may introduce candidates at the ASCA Annual Conference.
- ASCA may host a reception for candidates at the ASCA Annual Conference.
- ASCA may invite candidates to make a speech at the ASCA Annual Conference.
