
Dr. Melissa DeLaurentis










Longitudinal Progress Monitoring

The same concept holds true for the Test, Cross-Test Scores and Total Score.














Score Reporting on the SAT Suite of Assessments







Advantages of Advanced Placement

College & Career Readiness









AP courses are taught at a college level to build students' academic skills.

AP courses are capstones for many CTE programs.

Scores of 3+ on the AP exam earn global college credit.

Scores of 2+ on 23 exams qualify as demonstrations of competency.

AP students are more likely to be accepted at competitive colleges.

AP students are more likely to graduate from college.

AP allows students to explore subjects that interest them without cost.



Benefits of Taking AP

Advanced Placement for ALL Students



Research shows that students who take AP courses and exams are much more likely than their peers to complete a college degree on time —which means they avoid paying for, for example, a fifth year of tuition.

New evidence now shows there are benefits to taking AP courses even for students who don't meet that threshold. AP students who earn a score of 1 or 2 or average a score of 1 or 2 across their AP Exams in high school have better college outcomes than academically similar college students who did not take an AP course and exam.


