

What is the NMVC²?

New Mexico Virtual Course Consortium (NMVC²) is a growing state-led provider network of public districts and charters who serve as course providers to students across the state through a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the student's district or charter of residence.

The NMVC² was created to support public districts and charter schools in locating available supplemental online courses for subject areas that may be difficult to staff locally.

Consortium has made great strides in building parameters in which districts and charters can best provide and receive services in a cohesive and supportive way while retaining student enrollment.

The New Mexico Public Education Department is supporting public districts and charter schools to connect and expand access to learning opportunities for students and families.

New Mexico Virtual Course Consortium (NMVC²) is a growing state-led **provider** network of public districts and charters who serve as supplemental course providers to students across the state through a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the student's district or charter of **residence**.

NMVC² is committed to partnering.-not competing, with other state districts and charter schools to offer supplemental courses while the local districts retains student enrollment.

Providing LEA

A PED authorized district or charter that is able to provide a high quality, standardsaligned online courses, accessible to students, regardless of their location throughout the state.

NMVC²

The state network of Providing LEAs facilitated by PED. The course fees are:

Middle/High

The Consortium fee is \$375.00 per course, per semester

Elementary

The Consortium fee \$700.00 per course, per year (e.g. grade 5 ELA for entire year).












Courses the NMVC² Offers









How does a Residing LEA form a partnership with the Consortium Provider?





Designated Residing LEA Staff

Anyone from the district can reach out to the appropriate Providing LEA contact, but to keep things running efficiently, we will ask that someone be designated as the point of contact.



An MOU is executed

The Providing LEA and Residing LEA enter into an MOU. A sample template has been provided on the website.




Student Onboarding

The Providing LEA and Residing LEA communicate to provide the best onboarding experience for the student and family.

Required Exchange of Information

Residing LEA Provides

- Basic enrollment Information
- Sharing of special accommodations or supports that a student might need at the time of enrollment (extended time, text to speech if available, etc.)
- Sharing of applicable MLSS supports
- The student device; ensures that the enrolled student has access to internet



Providing LEA Provides

Final *Course Completion Report* to include:

- Grades (term)
- Quizzes, Course exams, Progress monitoring
- Attendance (in compliance with Attendance with Success Act.)
- Behavior reports (if needed)

The **Residing LEA** is responsible for entering all data in their SIS, and corresponding STARS reporting for all students they have enrolled in virtual course(s).







Consortium Course Fees

Fee Rational

Middle/High
