Dual Credit Participation at Moriarty High School (MHS)

When discussing dual credit best practices with Central New Mexico Community College, they mentioned Moriarty High School as a school that stood out to them for dual credit participation. Monique Baca, school counselor at MHS shared information about their program.

Hello NM school counselors! My name is Monique Baca and I am one of the school counselors at Moriarty High School. I have been a counselor for almost 10 years and have been at Moriarty since January 2019. One of my additional job duties is being the Dual Credit Coordinator. Being in a rural community makes things a little more difficult as everything has to be done online or remotely when dealing with colleges for dual credit. We offer a wide variety of dual credit courses at MHS. On campus we offer Welding, Carpentry, Information Systems, Computer-Aided Design, and Financial Literacy. We have a dual credit computer lab for students to take elective classes online through Central New Mexico Community College (CNM). We also partner with Mesalands Community College and Eastern New Mexico University for additional dual credit opportunities for our students. This school year we have about 235 students enrolled in a CNM dual credit course. The CNM dual credit process is a lengthy multistep process, which at times can be very stressful for our students. I work collaboratively with my on-site teachers, facilitators, co-counselor, and CNM to help students get through the process. I have created tutorial presentations with screenshots to help my students with the dual credit process. Presentations include how to apply as a dual credit student, how to register for classes, how to navigate the myCNM account, how to access classes, and how to upload assignments. If a student needs extra support they meet with me or my co-counselor. I communicate with CNM dual credit representatives and the admissions office regularly in case we run into any hiccups like getting holds removed for students. I believe that dual credit is a wonderful opportunity for our students and have had many students complete multiple dual credit courses that they are just about ready to have an associates degree. I would not be as successful as I am with our dual credit program if it wasn't for my amazing team.

Big Future Scholarships - There are no essay, minimum GPA, test score, or citizenship requirements. It's easy to enter scholarship drawings each month. Simply complete one BIGFUTURE of the steps before the deadline, and you'll be automatically entered to win \$500 and \$40,000! Students whose families earn less than \$60,000 a year have extra chances at scholarships because they're eligible for two entries each drawing.







NM Opportunity Scholarship- If you are an established New Mexico resident & plan to enroll in at least 6 credit hours at a public college or university in NM toward a training certificate, associate degree, or bachelor's degree, you may qualify.

The New Mexico Legislative Lottery Scholarship - The New Mexico Legislative Lottery Scholarship will pay up to 100% of tuition (up to an undergraduate degree) for students who meet the eligibility criteria.



The Dream, National Scholarship- We think of our National Scholarship as the "Pell Grant" for highly motivated undocumented students with significant, unmet financial need. While we consider THEDREAM. US your GPA, we place great emphasis on your demonstrated commitment to service and your ability to overcome the barriers that undocumented students face each and every day.

NMEAF's Scholarship, FAFSA Fund Your Future - New Mexico High School Seniors (residents of NM) can register to win a \$500 scholarship and/or prizes. High school seniors that register will be entered into a monthly, random drawing. To be eligible to win, student(s) must have completed the FAFSA, and show proof of completion. A student can only win once a year. The \$500 scholarships are for the fall of 2023 enrollment at any title IV eligible college, university, or trade school.





NM Scholars Scholarship - The New Mexico Scholars Scholarship encourages NM high school graduates to enroll in college full-time at a public or private non-profit postsecondary in NM before their 21st birthday in an undergraduate program.









The Counseling Department hosted 55 students/parents/guardians. Students completed both college applications and FAFSA forms. They even raffled seven \$20 visa gift cards!
